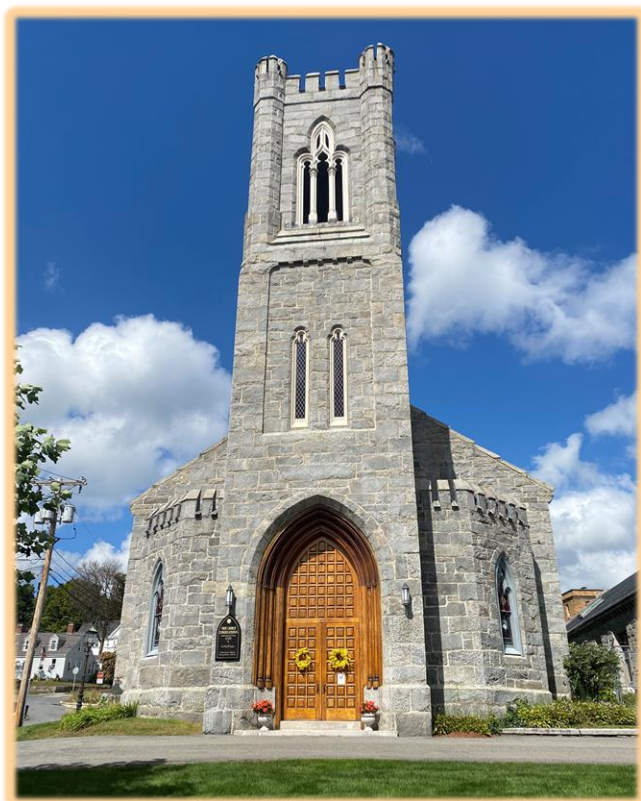

“GETTING PARSONAL” ***Rev. William D. Ingraham***

*We know that all things work together for good for those who love God,
who are called according to God’s purpose.*

~ Romans 8:28 (NRSV)

Because I didn’t quite get everything done prior to leaving New England on Monday for a week of vacation, I am writing this column on an early, bright and crisp southeast Michigan morning at the dining room table in the home of one of my Filipino sisters. The morning is quiet and still. My cup of coffee is cooling slightly beside me. A squirrel climbing the black walnut tree in the backyard draws my eye, and I wonder if it is he who I overheard dropping and chasing nuts across the roof earlier. I’m in a contemplative mood.

What's on my mind is the remarkable goodness of God. Not that I live my daily life devoid of a sense of God's many blessings, but somehow, vacation always brings that to mind. "*Count your many blessings, count them one by one,*" are the words to a song I learned to sing as a child. My Sunday School teachers could be proud. That lesson took deep root within me, especially when I take a moment to step out of my everyday life for time away. I have many blessings to number and am grateful.

We've just put a particularly difficult, even peculiar year and a half, nearly two years behind us. The time has been marked by remarkable uncertainty and worry, struggle and grief, trouble and even fear, in ways that none of us, not even anyone in the world, has experienced before. As time passed, we moved through different measures of worry and even fear, eventually finding a way beyond the most desperate of days to ones where things seemed somewhat more manageable. Eventually, with the advent both of vaccines and effective treatments, the more extreme concerns and worries have calmed a bit, and the harsh edges of fear and doubt have started to soften.

As we moved into the summer that just ended, it was as if our whole nation breathed a sigh of relief as our lives opened again. Yet it has felt a little short lived. The delta variant soon asserted itself, and infections and deaths went back on the rise, especially in areas with low vaccination rates. Our part of the country has not been as hard hit, but still, we've realized the need to proceed with some caution. The extreme precautions of March and April 2020 have not been warranted (and hopefully will not be) but are reminded that some measures of precaution are still needed. Our lives as individuals and a community continue to be affected by the coronavirus.

Things are not yet back in full swing at the church. While we're eager to return to holding Sunday School and Fellowship, the time has not yet come where we are able to do that. In the meantime, I am grateful for the blessing of hybrid worship. Members and friends of our congregation can be present together every week both in the sanctuary and online, all at the same time. I look forward to increasing numbers of in-person worshippers through the Fall, moving toward Christmas, and am hopeful that we will see the same trend online, at the same time. One of the blessings of the pandemic for us has been a broadened reach into the community. I pray that will continue to be the case as we move forward. As more in-person activities at the church can come online, I'm confident even more people will come to participate in them.

A crucial part of our lives that has been missing in the pandemic has been the opportunity to grieve together our many losses from the last year and a half. Vast numbers of people have died from the coronavirus, both in our nation and globally. Most if not all of us have known someone who died of Covid-19, if not several people. And those were not the only deaths that occurred during the past year. The cycle of life and death continued throughout the pandemic, yet memorial and funeral services were limited or curtailed all together, and even those that did happen, most of us were unable to attend due to covid safety protocols.

Grieving together is an essential part of being a community of faith. Naming our loss before God, celebrating together the blessings of life and love shared and the great sadness we feel at its loss, we commend our loved ones to God's goodness and care. At the same time, we are reminded that God holds all of us in eternal mercy and compassion, both the living and the dead. All our days, no matter the number, are a blessing, and are marked by the presence of one whose love will never let us go.

To that end, I am planning a "*Service for Grief and Gladness*" on the last Sunday of this month, October 31st. That is All Hallows' Eve, but also is the day before All Saints' Day. It seems an appropriate time to name our losses together before God, express our grief, and draw on the hope and strength of

boundless heavenly love and compassion. God's tenderness and mercy have seen us through both hardships and blessings our whole lives long, and for countless generations.

More details about this service will be shared as we come closer to the end of the month. In the meantime, please think of what names you would like lifted in worship that day. And too, consider other losses of the past year and a half that we should name together in worship.

My intention for this service, as well as my hope and my prayer, is that it can help us to move through and beyond our grief and help us offer God our praise.

I'm going to go back to my vacation now. Know that I hold you all in my heart and in my prayers. I'm so grateful for our lives and ministry together.

NIN Tuesday Evening Food Pantry

The Food Pantry has successfully transitioned to a new procedure. All the food previously stored in the Parish Hall has been removed. The weekly food to be distributed is delivered to the parking lot between 4:00 and 4:30 PM each Tuesday. The bags are assembled and when the pantry is over at 6:30 PM, NIN sends their truck back to pick up any leftover food. There are a few supplies and needed items stored in the Crib Room. The biggest adjustment is that the Pantry is no longer able to accept any food donations since they do not have a place to store them.

The Chapel School



Routines are a wonderful thing. They give us a path to follow, keeps us focused on what needs to be done and ultimately gives us a sense of accomplishment that we are moving in the right direction. The children have all settled in here at the Chapel School. We had a few bumps in the road in the beginning and along the way but now have settled into that rhythm. That's always a good feeling. There may still be bumps or an occasional curve ball thrown in from time to time but nothing we can't handle.

Our enrollment is holding at 71 children, and we have 30 children enrolled in Lunch Bunch, many 5 days a week. Early drop off and extended day pickup is averaging about 7 children a day. Better than two years ago. Last year we were not able to offer the early and late options due to Covid.

School Pictures will take place on Wednesday, October 13th and Thursday, October 14th. Steve Alfano will be here from PortraitEfx to capture everyone's smiles, even the staff. Not only does Steve provide parents with beautiful pictures and option packages, but he also provides Chapel pictures for our files to identify all the children. This is critical especially with so many children with peanut and tree nut allergies, dairy allergies and more. We must be sure we have the right child, with the right medication, with the right dose, at the right time. No easy task especially when time is critical to save a child's life.

There are lots to be thankful for as we begin year two of Covid. The children are enjoying spending time on the playground. The weather has been beautiful. The children are back in the Parish Hall for Lunch Bunch and able to eat lunch all together. Everyone is wearing a mask and still following many health and safety protocols. Our separate drop off and pickup doors is greatly reducing the number of people in the building. Having separate assigned bathrooms for each classroom rather than boy/girl bathrooms is also reducing our contact with others.

Continue to be safe everyone!!

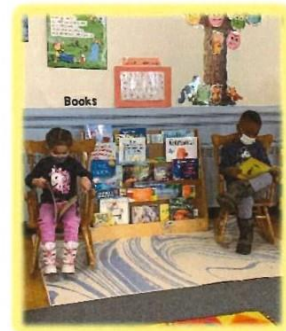

A Note from Pat Moss-Newbury...

As I sit at my computer this morning, I am surrounded by the sounds of people going to work, school, walking their dogs, construction vehicles, people riding bicycles, and other community sounds. My thoughts drift back to Methuen. It has been over one year since Covid hit and everyone has been thru a lot. Some of the events have been frightening and has made us think how we go about our daily chores. It has been a long journey and difficult for adults, as well as children.

When Covid hit, we knew nothing about the disease. Not where it came from, how it traveled here, how it could affect us. We have learned so much. We have analyzed the data which is constantly changing and figured out the right way for each of us to proceed.

For my First Church family, it has been a long road filled with twists, turns, detours and “dead ends” but we seem to be on a straight path. We started our worship in Pastor Bill’s office. Thru his creativity he constructed a “paper congregation,” complete with accessories! Our congregation sent pictures of flowers, some hand drawn, some were photos to brighten his office for Sunday worship. We then relocated to Pastor Bill’s yard for worship where we could see nature and occasionally lost his words due to technical difficulties or the sounds of sirens where his words were sometimes lost. We were introduced to Cowboy Joe, Jules, and Sailor Sidney. Finally, it was back into the sanctuary! What a trip and we never left our homes!

None of these accomplishments were done alone. It takes a village, and our village has been running on overtime since the beginning. People tirelessly give their time and energy putting others first. There are so many people who “dug in” to make Sunday worship possible. The Board has done and continues to do more research to ensure the safety of the congregation. Our “computer/technical” people have learned how to use newly installed equipment to make Sunday worship possible. Our Trustees who always make sure the building is ready and improvements have been made to ensure a safe place to worship. The Diaconate, who make sure everything is in place and is ready for Sunday worship. A new air filtration system to ensure proper air circulation was installed. The office staff, who make sure everything is up and running for Chapel School, as well as all of their office duties. Everyone who volunteers for Neighbors in Need – I believe not one week has been missed during this time. Other committee members make sure updates were safe and reached out to members who needed assistance connecting to worship and various meetings.

We never lost faith and hope that one day First Church would reopen, and we would one day be together again. It has been a long road and we still have a way to go. Baby steps.

I am sad when few people attend Sunday worship and the Zoom meetings Pastor Bill has set up for us to “gather” after worship, but I get it. We all have had to make adjustments to our previous lifestyle. Life goes on and it will never be the way it was pre Covid. We have learned a different way to exist. We have learned to take others into consideration, and not taking anyone for granted, keeping each other safe and moving forward. Yet, as a community, you have been wonderful helping each other. Volunteering to do weekly shopping, phone calls to keep folks connected, emails and texting as well as other “acts of kindness”, You are the best! You are NOT a community of I or Me, but a community of WE.

I hope you will forgive my “rant”. For me, writing is therapy. I wanted to let you all know, you matter and are in my thoughts and prayers every day.
