

"GETTING PARSONAL"

Gratitude is broadly defined as the quality of being thankful; having a readiness to show appreciation for and to return kindness. In researching a bit further, I found a study within the academic field of Applied Positive Psychology that demonstrate having an attitude of gratitude has positive influence on our quality of life. Therapist Derrick Carpenter states, "People who regularly practice gratitude by taking time to notice and reflect upon the things they're thankful for experience more positive emotions, feel more alive, sleep better, express more compassion and kindness, and even have stronger immune systems."

Life is better lived in a state of gratitude. But it's not always easy! Bad things happen, struggles arise, and troubles persist, both in personal and community life. Sometimes the difficulties are long-term with no resolution in sight. In these moments especially, I find it helpful to ground myself in small snippets of gratitude. I stop to recognize the gift of a hot cup of coffee or a smile from a stranger, a flowering tree or a song on the radio, a warm breeze or a splash of sunshine. Further, I make myself say out loud: "Thank you!" The words may be spoken to the wind, a person, or are offered to God as a prayer. When the going gets rough and the day is tough, I stop, take a breath, and open my eyes and my heart to discern gratitude. And I give thanks.

Then there are moments when gratitude comes easily, when words and feelings of appreciation flow easily and generously, from our mouths and from our hearts. We're facing such a moment this



Stories of the Cross

A source of giving

One parishioner of First Church Congregational has given away a lot of crosses. A whole lot of crosses! He gives them to coworkers, friends at his club, people he just met, ministers he talks with, and friends of friends. Anyone who he thinks would appreciate it, he gives it to them freely.

What surprises the parishioner is the response he gets from people. For the majority, the recipients almost always say "this is great – I'm going to give it to my mother." ...or friend with cancer. ...or sibling looking for a job. ...or co-worker having marital issues. ...or cousin in recovery. Very few people actually intend to keep it for themselves. Instead, they see the gift, a simple wooden cross, as a way they themselves can give to others. The drive to pay it forward, especially with a symbol of faith, is nearly constant in all who receive faith.

In these cases, he gives them two crosses.



These stories of the cross are documented from true experiences related to a mission of First Church Congregational. We invite you to make your own experience through the simple act of sharing part of our faith through the cross. SURVEY OF INTERESTS & TALENTS

We would like to thank all of you who took the time and effort to fill out the Survey of Interests & Talents. It's exciting to see all of the different passions, interests and skills that are represented in the summary of information you have provided. There are so many different possibilities presented from social activities to activities that can make a difference in people's lives.

Over the next several months we will be sharing this information with the church Board, teams and committees. If you haven't already taken the time to review the survey results, they are posted on the Survey Boards in the Parish Hall. As you look at the results, we encourage you to imagine the various opportunities in which you might be interested. For example under the category of "I want to participate in Fellowship," there are 12 people interested in Biking, 14 in Camping, 13 in Fellowship around Movies, 14 in Hiking, 20 in Walking and 20 in a Women's Group.

If one of these opportunities speaks to you, or something else in the survey does, consider talking with those of similar interests to see if there is interest in starting a group. You can talk with Pastor Bill or any member of the Stewardship Team, and we will help you get started. There are so many different opportunities to increase fellowship and shared interests among the congregation.

For those interested in some details from the survey, we had 70 survey responses returned, 59 from adults and 11 from our youth. 49 women responded as did 17 men. As you look at the survey results, you will notice that we separated the adult and youth so each group can more clearly see their group's interests & talents.

There is a lot of information in the surveys to reflect on and to consider how best to use to further our mission of "Seeking God. Caring for Each Other. Improving our Community." We ask all to consider how we can personally use this information to further our individual journey embracing our Mission Statement.

OUTREACH TEAM

NIN Methuen Tuesday Evening Food Pantry

- As the year has progressed, attendance at the NIN Methuen Tuesday Evening Food Pantry has increased. We are now serving an average of 120 families each week.
- Each Tuesday we have 13 to 17 volunteers who help set up the food, serve it and clean up afterward. Our volunteers come from First Church as well as the community at large. If you are interested volunteering, please call Ken Peck at 978-375-4348.
- There is a NIN Food Bin in the Parish Hall. We are grateful for the people who regularly contribute food to the bin.
- We needed a new refrigerator at the Food Pantry. Ken Peck asked Pastor Bill to help us raise
 money for this project. Pastor Bill successfully solicited funds from the local and national
 Exchange Clubs. These funds were combined with money Outreach had in its budget last year
 to enable us to purchase the new refrigerator.

Stride into the Light 5K Walk/Run – May 4, 2019

- Eight members of the Outreach Team volunteered to join the Stride into the Light Planning Committee for this year's 5K Walk/Run. We did things like distribute posters in the local community, solicit sponsors and raffle items, write letters to and telephone local mental health organizations, churches and Methuen politicians, paperwork to obtain raffle permit, and day of the event activities.
- Since so many of our members volunteered to work on Stride this year, our May meeting was used to do a Stride debriefing for all the Stride Committee. We talked about all the things that went well this year as well as the things on which we can improve next year.

Community Activities

- One of our goals this year is to explore possibilities of new partnerships with community organizations with whom we already partner. To further this exploration, we invited Laura Gomez, Community Outreach Coordinator/Assistant, from the Methuen Arlington Neighborhood Association Inc. (MAN, Inc.) to our March meeting. We talked with her about possible other ways we can partner with MAN besides the Back to School Program with which we have partnered with them for the past eight years.
- Laura came to our meeting with a dozen different ideas for us to consider. Her enthusiasm, energy and excitement in talking about the opportunities to partner with MAN have given us much to talk and think about.

On Saturday, May 4, 2019 our Church and community came together to host the 5th Annual Stride Into the Light 5k Walk-Run! Year after year, I have been overjoyed to see the progress we have made. And this year was no different, as our committee jumped over hurdle after hurdle, to make sure we once again exceeded our goal!

From the sea of volunteers, to the amazing jump in overall numbers, we have made great strides this year, not only for the race, but for our voice in the community. With that voice, we had a total of 135 attendees take to the streets as either runners or walkers! Add in our Volunteers, and we had over 150 attendees supporting this cause, and showing great pride in this event right outside our Church doors!

Our committee was pivotal this year in making our numbers such a great success. The team reached out to over 50 potential sponsors in the community, bringing back donations and support from over 30 of those locations! We reached out to over 14 Mental Health organizations and contacted 18 local churches to join our support and help grow our numbers. An amazing accomplishment!

This year, we made some great changes and improvements. Over the past four years, we have proudly supported two non-profits, McLean Hospital and Level Ground, MMA. But to truly make a meaningful impact in our area, we teamed up with Family Services' Samaritans of Merrimack Valley, located in Lawrence! Their partnership already spoke volumes as we welcomed Guest Speakers, Debbie and Ellie, to kick start our event this year! With their support, we will reach hundreds of advocates in the mental health community and will continue to help our efforts grow!

Striding toward our goal had a slow start, but a big finish! Did I mention we had official timing this year to track our runners with our partnership with Bay State Race Timing? This was a great draw in the local community to get support from some local run clubs, such as the Whirlaway Sports Team and the Merrimack Valley Striders! And believe me, they can run!

With each helping hand and voice, the 2019 event raised \$10,921, and counting! Overall, the Stride Into the Light 5k has donated over \$47,500.00 to our causes! Truly remarkable and a blessing!

We look forward to the future of this event, as it continues to help those that need to be heard.


