

"GETTING PARSONAL"

Rev. William D. Ingraham

March marks the one-year anniversary of our personal interaction with the Covid-19 coronavirus global pandemic. While it was evolving some weeks or months before on the global stage, it was mid-March when the pandemic struck home, leading our church to end public gatherings, close Chapel School and move into a fully remote mode of operation. Remarkably, we never missed a Sunday service. We shifted immediately to live broadcast. The Board met remotely, initially on conference call and then on Zoom. Committees and Ministry teams reimagined how they could work in our new context.

The vision, creativity and sheer determination of our church, our staff, our leaders and groups, have facilitated our ministry in remarkable ways. It is worth celebrating some of our accomplishments here.

Within days of lock down we moved the *Methuen Tuesday Night Food Pantry* up to the church. We devised an innovative, contactless, "drive thru" model of food distribution that was safe for volunteers and clients. The new approach maintained the compassionate, inter-personal model that has been the hallmark of our pantry from its founding. One year ago, 200 families were a large turnout for us. Last week the pantry served 498 families! It's now the largest weekly food pantry in the area, accounting for about 50% of the total Neighbors in Need weekly volume.

Last summer we re-envisioned the annual MAN Inc. Back to School Backpack Project, too. We moved "Mall Day," traditionally held in Parish Hall, down to the Tenney Street Playground, serving our neighborhood's kids and families outside, where it was safe. Looking forward to this summer, we have planned to increase the number of kids we serve from the usual 75 to 100. It will be a large undertaking!

Our annual Stride into the Light walk/run for suicide prevention and mental health awareness was first postponed, then later, canceled last spring. It just came too early in the pandemic for us to discern what to do. However, we are now switching to a virtual model so that we can hold the walk/run this spring. We will also have a special "Mental Health Sunday" this year, held on the last Sunday of March.

Perhaps among our greatest accomplishments is the weekly broadcast of worship, live, first from my office, then the parsonage backyard, and finally, the sanctuary. We have sure had our bumps along the way! To meet our needs, and provide a high-quality virtual worship experience, we took a *huge* step forward in technology, installing an unobtrusive three camera system permanently in our sanctuary. Our live broadcast of worship has had a reach far broader than ever we imagined. As an example, our Ash Wednesday service had 647 views this year. In 2020, we were thrilled to have a few more than 30 people attend our Ash Wednesday service.

We know it will be a while still before we can return to in-person worship, Christian education, meetings and fellowship. Know that our leadership and staff continue to monitor closely the numbers in our community, paying heed to the advice of state and federal health officials, as well as taking into account best practices as laid out by the UCC in the Southern New England Conference and national setting. And of course, as has been our practice since the earliest days of the pandemic, we will keep you fully informed every step along the way.

In the meantime, I ask us all to put our thinking caps on. As we look to the future, when public worship, gathering together for work and fellowship, education and service can resume, what should be most important to us? What will we need most as a church? And what can we best offer to the community? The coming months and years afford us a unique opportunity to reestablish ourselves as an active, effective congregation. It's a chance to bring new enthusiasm and fervor to the old tasks and long-held, cherished traditions. No doubt we can find better, more fitting ways to do our work in the present day. And it is also an opportunity for us to dream big, aspiring to new ways to live and serve together in Christ's name. We might just find something new and meaningful that we have to offer that never would have occurred to us before. In fact, I'm *certain* that we will! And it all starts when we open our hearts and our minds to God's possibilities.

Our church has been blessed in countless ways for almost three centuries. We share a rich and remarkable history. And the best is yet to come!





Mental Health Sunday April 25, 2021

Outreach is pleased to announce we have secured two outstanding speakers for this year's Mental Health Sunday on April 25. They are the same speakers we invited for Mental Health Sunday last year but had to cancel due to the Pandemic. Their topic is Substance Abuse. You may recall the topic for Mental Health Sunday in 2019 was Suicide Prevention. That service was well attended and very well received.

Doug Griffin, of Newton, NH, has become one of the country's top drug reform advocates following the death of his 20 year old daughter from a drug overdose. **Cole Welch**, a recovered addict, is currently a Community Engagement Specialist in the Methuen Police Department. She helps find beds and resources for addicts in Methuen. They will share their knowledge, experience, and insights on substance abuse issues.

Virtual 2021 Stride into the Light Race/Walk

First Church's annual "Stride into the Light Race/Walk" is held to raise awareness to mental health issues, especially in the Merrimack Valley. The dates for this year are **Saturday, May 15 through Saturday, May 22**. These dates will allow people to run/walk at a time convenient to them. Kerri Bedard is continuing to work with us on planning this year's virtual race/walk. She is currently looking to find a web platform we can afford that will allow us to register walkers and to accept donations. Due to the Pandemic virtual races are prolific and web platforms have proliferated and become expensive. As our plans develop further, we will provide you with more information, but please **save the dates and plan to participate.**

Souper Bowl of Caring

Thanks to our amazing church family and their friends, our 2021 Souper Bowl of Caring surpassed its goals! NIN Tuesday Evening Food Pantry

Due to bad winter weather, the Food Pantry has had to move the NIN Tuesday Evening Food Pantry from Tuesday evening to Wednesday evening on February 3, 10 and 17. On February 10th the Pantry served 352 families and on February 17th the Pantry served 372 families. We thank our church family and the many community members who continue to donate food to our pantry, and all the volunteers who come out in the cold weather each week to serve these families.



2021 Souper Bowl Challenge

What a great finish to the 2021 Souper Bowl of Caring! First Church together with The Chapel School and the community collected 1265 cans of soup and raised \$1780 in donations for Neighbors in Need!

Although we are not physically in church, the competition between Team Right and Team Left was outstanding! Team Right donated 332 cans of soup and \$675 in donations for a final score of 1007, while Team Left donated 851 cans of soup and \$975 in donations for a final score of 1726 to win the First Church Souper Bowl trophy!

A kind, helpful person wrote:

A few days ago, I stopped in CVS to pick up something and I noticed an older woman struggling to use a kiosk computer to print out her reward coupons. Now, I am no expert in technology, as my children could attest to, but I figured we could figure it out together. I helped her navigate through the confusing screens and soon her coupons were being printed. She thanked me warmly and was quickly on her way to the register. It was such a brief encounter, but the positive human connection put me on the path for a great day.

Sometimes we are the ones in need of kindness. You may choose to lie to your friends (and yourself) when they ask how you are doing, and you say fine, but you really are not. So the next time a trusted friend asks how you are doing, be honest, and if you need, to ask for help. Taking care of yourself, indulging in a little self-kindness is as important as sharing kindness with others.

The NIN/FCC Food Pantry

This Neighbors in Need/First Church Congregational Food Pantry has evolved into quite an amazing act of kindness. It deserves special recognition for how it impacts the lives of members of our community. The pantry was founded by Marilyn and Ken Peck, and Ken continues to oversee all aspects of its daily needs. The pandemic required the pantry to vacate its original site and relocate to Parish Hall at First Church. That in itself was a monumental task and involved moving all the food, tables, and refrigeration (huge freezers and a milk cooler). The small team of volunteers was dedicated and certainly had to demonstrate their strong backs and indominable spirits to complete.

As the community need grew, so did the need for food and volunteers. New procedures had to be developed to comply with Covid safety rules, and to safely distribute food. It became an inside/outside process. Inside, volunteers filled bags with the groceries, which were taken outside and our clients would drive through the parking lot and pick up their food. The lines grew, many more people came on Tuesday afternoon, and despite very hot weather in the summer, leading to very cold, snowy weather in the winter, the food bags get prepared and distributed.

But there are also special things going on provided by some kind and caring individuals. COVID families have received food delivery to assist them through trying times. Shut ins are offered home delivery. The weekly drop offs get a bit extended each week as new friendships are formed and time is needed to catch up. NIN contacts Ken with the names and addresses of people in need, and he takes it from there. What an amazing operation, and how fortunate we are to have the huge number of dedicated volunteers that we do. Kindness abounds!


Continue to pray for all those helping you during these very hard times.


- 1. Bring can goods to the church to help all those in need of food.

- 4. Make a Kindness rock or two. You may paint it, or just write a word on it. Whatever you would like. Save it, as we will want it for our Rock Garden.






Dear Outreach Committee and Church Members,

Walking into the church after being away for almost a whole year brought tears to my eyes. It felt like a privilege to enter that day and participate in documenting what happens each Sunday while most of the congregation continues to watch from home.

Stacey Murray, Carol Sanborn, and Patrick Wright have spent countless volunteer hours getting the AV system up and running to bring what we miss so much about the church to our screens at home. Although there are still some kinks to work out, their efforts to produce a flawless production do not go without appreciation. The team continues to work tirelessly with our tech support partner, Kinly, to remedy any issues within the system.

Each Sunday morning, the team arrives at 8:30 AM to set up everything needed to bring church service to you at home. From graphics and visually beautiful preset camera angles to setting up microphones for each person and musical element, to sound and volume checks on our sound system, everything is checked and checked again to ensure the best possible level of success. At 9:50 AM the production goes live with opening visuals and lovely organ music.

Throughout the live service, Facebook is monitored and readings and other important information is posted. Prayer requests sent through the chat or private message are also written down and addressed. If any technical issue is noticed, the team springs into action to correct the problem as soon as possible.

After the service, the team continues to work uploading the service to YouTube, and Facebook. Any prayer requests sent through the chat or private message are given to Pastor Bill to ensure they are heard. They also spend time preparing graphics and other production elements to enrich future services.
